Stats back in library's stacks

NORWALK -- Don't be surprised to see local historian Henry Timman
'physically embracing' microfilmed copies of vital statistic records
that

were returned early yesterday to the Norwalk Public Library after
being

confiscated by the Huron County General Health District.

'We ordered (the health district) to return the records to the
library,' said Prosecutor

Russell Leffler, whose office was asked to issue a legal opinion when
the health

department removed the estimated 20 microfilm rolls from the library on
June 30.

The records contain birth and death statistics and became a bone of
contention between

the Huron County Genealogical Society, which paid for copying the
records, and the
health district.

As an Ohio Library employee and a person who works with genealogy issues, I can state this much for you:

The new law that went into effect July 1, 2003 caused a huge uproar in the Ohio genealogy community. The reason given for this change was explained as "protection against identity theft". I don't exactly buy into that reason. I do know that it caused certified copies cost to go from \$10 to \$15 and did away completely with uncertified copies. Also, in the past I could contact our local health depts. and ask them to search for a death date for me. Now they no longer will do that unless I pay the \$15 fee which of course I will not!

Hope this helps a little.

Suzanne,

We had death certificates on microfilm in our library for the years 1908-1995. The Huron County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society had purchased them and was housing them in our library. When the laws changed this summer, one interpretation was that the records could only be housed by Health Depts., so our county health dept. came and took the records from our library.

The Gen. Society actually owned the records, so they were the ones to pursue it. After some time and a lot of hard feelings, the County Prosecutor made the decision that the records should be returned to us. We do have them back, but no one is sure it's over.

As far as I know, the other libraries who had records taken have not gotten them back.

I don't usually jump in on these question, but since we have access
to AncestryPlus and HeritageQuest online, I wanted to let the others
know of our experience. The Great Bend (Kansas) Public Library
serves a population of 15,000. We paid \$500 a year before the state
library negotiated for a statewide contract with Heritage Quest
online. I don't know what the state contract costs. We took money
from our CD-ROM budget to afford \$1,500 to pay for AncestryPlus. Both
services are wonderful tools for genealogists.

I use our technology lab to teach classes on genealogy. Anyone who

It's interesting that the Gale Rep told you that New York
Passenger Lists is only available via Ancestry.com. Our library
subscribes to AncestryPlus and we are able to access the lists and
images just fine.

From the main AncestryPlus page go to Immigration Records and
click on ...more. New York Passenger Lists is available under Featured
Immigration and Emigration Collections. This database is an index to
the passenger lists of ships arriving from foreign ports at the port of
New York from 1851-1891 and links to images. Ancestry is still in the
process of uploading these images and indexes. I don't know what their
time frame is, but as of now they seem to have most of the images for
1850-1862. You can browse by year > month > ship. It doesn't appear
these images are searchable via an index yet. I got no hits for Smith!
Still, this is one of the few places other than the Ellis Island website
that offers digital images of ship manifests.

I'm excited about the potential of this database. For now
anyway, it seems to be available to libraries through AncestryPlus. I
hope it is not removed!

However, whenever I use AncestryPlus, I receive the dreaded page cannot be found message. For example, if I do a keyword search on the name Levander I get search results ok, but whenever I click on a link, I get the page cannot be displayed message.

Approximately six months ago, we installed the ?PC Reservation

Station.? At first, we thought it would be more work for us. However, it has solved so many problems.

We have 9 computers. Patrons come to our desk and they must receive a pin and computer number. They then go to the computer and enter the pin number. Our bookmarks page then comes up with the time that they are allowed, which is 60 minutes. They will be given a 5-minute warning. They must let us know if they want their time extended. Depending on the number of people waiting, we can extend it from 1-5 hours. We rarely extend it more than one hour.

This helps us in the following ways:

- 1) No more bickering between patrons as to who was there first and how long.
- 2) No more children jumping on the computers without checking in first. And, they no longer can change any of our bookmarks.
- 3) The computer now keeps our usage stats and a monthly report is given to the director.

We really love it.

We also have AncestryPlus with 16 consecutive ports which can be
accessed at any PC at any of our branches. We also have Heritage
Quest. I am very thankful (and so are our patrons) that we can
offer both because they do complement each other.

Because of the heavy user demand on all of our PC's we use SAM (Public Library Internet Access Program) from Comprise Technologies, Inc. This is system-wide and limits use of any public PC to two hours per user/card holder per day. At the end of the first hour, the patron is disconnected but he/she can log in for a second hour unless other patrons are waiting.

We have three PC's in our Local History & Genealogy Department which are reserved for people doing Missouri/Genealogy research. Just outside our room are 27 other PC's for use by the general public who must have either a library card or a guest computer card. In addition, there are 6 more PC's in our Young Adult Department.

This week I had an experience of someone finding a family on the 1900 California Soundex, but they couldn't find them on Heritage Quest. We went to the 1900 CA Census reel for Lassen County, and discovered that the desired page (page 5 within ED 48 or 49) was never filmed. The filming went from page 4B to page 6A. Hence the image was never digitized by Heritage Quest.

Similarly, earlier this year, a patron discovered that the first page of the 1850 census of Allen County was not included on the microfilm. He had seen an earlier typescript of the census compiled in the 1950s, so he knew the page once existed. So he went to the National Archives to look at the original schedule and found the desired page right where it was supposed to be.

My question: Does anyone know if NARS has a procedure for correcting filming problems such as these? Is there a process for making such problems known to them? Will there ever be plans for new filmings? And finally, if the corrections are made, will Ancestry and Heritagequest make the necessary corrections in their own databases?

I think these problems, though rare, underscore the need for stressing to patrons how important it is that they examine the filmed soundexes and older census transcripts (when available), in doing census research.

As to the 1900 thru 1930 censuses, filming errors cannot be corrected because the original schedules were destroyed by the Census Bureau after the filming was done. In that case, researchers will have to make do with the information on the soundex cards which were prepared from the original schedules.

As to the 1880 census, decades ago the National Archives transferred the original schedules to the various state libraries or state archives.

The original 1790 thru 1870 schedules are in the National Archives Building, Washington, DC. So far as I know, we have not established a procedure for filming census pages that "exist but were missed during filming" but I will forward this message to the two most appropriate management people.

Baltimore has two filmings - one to the city lists and one to the customs list. You need to make sure you have looked at the correct index to the list you are looking at. M327 is the soundex to the customs lists (1820-1897). Those original lists are fragmentary, especially in the 1840s and what remains are the quarterly abstracts (M596). The original lists were destroyed in a fire. M326 is a soundex to the city lists (M255). Hope this helps.

Yes, if one has the money for it. Our patron clientele likes having both AncestryPlus and HeritageQuest Online. Having both services allows us to offer them census images with search engines for every census (1790-1930 minus 1890). HeritageQuest is particularly popular because of its clearer images as opposed to Ancestry's. Often, a patron, finding the name in a census search in Ancestry, will use that information to browse Heritage's images for a better image (and consequently, a better photostat from our laser printer). Another reason for having Heritage is access to their "Books" section. Although the State Library of Ohio has a 7,000 volume family history collection and a Family Name File of several thousand vertical files, there are at least that many family history titles with full text in Heritage's "Books". It is a veritable library in itself. Unfortunately, I find the search engine very cumbersome. Nevertheless, it is information almost totally different from what Ancestry has in its thousands of databases outside of the census records. Here, at the State Library, we are upbeat about both of these services. Once again, I see cost as the only barrier to not having both of these excellent services.

Seconded. We've been using LPT:One for two years and it's heaven.

We're still using a signup sheet for computer use rather than an automated system, but we have also found that switching from booking time to first come, first serve has improved patron flow remarkably. Most don't stay for the hour we allow; probably closer to half an hour. Conflicts are rare. If someone wants to stay longer, we don't interfere unless we have people waiting.

I should say that the above limits are for our Internet/Microsoft Office machines; we also have machines dedicated our catalog, databases and a few selected Web sites (e.g., our local history and genealogy). These have no time limit and most of our Ancestry users gravitate to them.

We also have AncestryPlus with 16 consecutive ports which can be accessed at any PC at any of our branches. We also have Heritage Quest. I am very thankful (and so are our patrons) that we can offer both because they do complement each other.

Because of the heavy user demand on all of our PC's we use SAM (Public Library Internet Access Program) from Comprise Technologies, Inc. This is system-wide and limits use of any public PC to two hours per user/card holder per day. At the end of the first hour, the patron is disconnected but he/she can log in for a second hour unless other patrons are waiting.

We have three PC's in our Local History & Genealogy Department which are reserved for people doing Missouri/Genealogy research. Just outside our room are 27 other PC's for use by the general

public who must have either a library card or a guest computer card. In addition, there are 6 more PC's in our Young Adult Department.

2. Nope. We are lucky to have an inventory.

3. We eat all the costs, for cataloging, housing, preservation, duplicating, etc. We do get to ask the owners to please let prospective publishers get their copyright reprint permission, but when the owners don't reply for months, you know who takes the heat, cause the materials are in THE LIBRARY.

Not a good idea. You want a warm shelf, build it and store it yourself. Else wise give it to us free and clear, all rights that you can grant, etc. The idea of accepting conditional gifts, providing all the feed and housing, and then not being able to control them, is difficult to work with.

Tempting as your request is you have stumbled into a "moderated" list for genealogy librarians. This forum is for librarians who attempt on occasion to discuss issues in librarianship as well as how to become more proficient in answering genealogy questions. But we are not able to handle genealogy questions on this list.

I recommend that you do a few things. Go to your nearest public library, no matter how large or small, and ask for assistance. There may be someone on staff who handles genealogy questions, there may be a genealogy or local history collection in your local library system or they may need to refer you to someone who can help you.

You want to seek out a good genealogy beginners class which may be offered through your local library or the one they refer you to. Ask about genealogical societies and clubs in your area. Do not forget to look in the business section of your local telephone book for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. It is a church but under the listings there may be a Family History Center listing. If there is call that number and see about visiting them and chatting with the volunteers who run the place.

As you have email capabilities you may want to seek out Cyndislist.com or FamilySearch.com Both sites have excellent help pages and beginners guides.

You may find examples of this type of agreement called Deposit Agreements. I have some in my files somewhere I will be happy to photocopy and mail. When I came to this collection in 1997, we had been doing the same thing but with no paper trail. I managed to convince our library board that as a rule, we really should not accept new collections without owning those collections. There's the issue of using public resources (ours) to benefit a private organization (even if it is a non-profit) .

I have had good luck in convincing some of these organizations to donate their materials and have gotten paperwork taken care of even if I have no clue how we originally got it or when.

Most of the women's organizations are pleased to be asked to make the donations and understand about pieces of their materials that have gotten buried under a bed or in an attic and disappeared over the years. They are happy to have a place to house it, preserve it, and have it available for future generations. Sometimes the men's organizations do not see this big picture.

The Society of American Archivists has some good brochures that encourage donating materials to an appropriate repository. Once is about donating your organization's records. You might want to check out what you can find on their website.

Just point out all the benefits of having y'all own the materials and start selling - I know, it's like the ONLY thing we have to do :-)

1.

Our remote access does not work well for us, but we are unique. On many other sites this works quite well. HQ can give you a few lines of code that must be added to a link on your web page. This will do the authentication for you. HQ cannot figure out why ours does not work well. Our remote users must enter their library card number TWICE in order for it to connect without needing additional authentication. (It ALWAYS works after entering the number the second time.)

2.

Would you share the responses with me please? We have not been able to work out authentication with HQ and our consortium which uses Dynix Horizon.

3.

Our computer tech worked with HQ's technical people so that our cards are recognized. Our guy created a web query box that requests the patron's library card number. The cards issued by our library all begin with the same 5 digit sequence and are 14 digits long. The secret inside info is that HQ is set up to recognize the 5 digit sequence of our library card and ... additional digits after that.

4.

We just asked HQ to set it up to recognize our library cards numbers. All our numbers start with the same five digits and are the same length. HQ had no problem doing that for us. No extra charge.

5.

Our library provides remote access to Heritage Quest through a password and id method. It is my understanding that the remote access is free with the subscription. Patrons go to our web page, click Electronic Databases, select the home access part of Heritage Quest and type the password and id in the box. HQ home users using AOL must minimize it and open up Internet Explorer or Netscape. Cookies must be enabled and the security setting needs to be at medium. Personal firewalls on home computers cause a problem with the remote access. Mac users may not be able to use the database. Despite the problems some home users encounter I like HQ. The tech people have also been very helpful when I call regarding a patrons remote problems.

6.

This database is available to us through a group of databases called TexShare. All Texas libraries can participate and pay a much lower fee to the Texas State Library than they would to each individual database vendor. The remote access works this way. Patrons have a specific web site they must go to. We provide the username and password for them to access all the databases. It's the same username and password for all patrons so we have it printed on a brochure all about the databases.

Due to just this problem we've installed the Mozilla browser on

our public computers and we run our Heritage Quest access through Mozilla. Mozilla has a built-in popup killer that you can turn on or off. Unfortunately many sites are written only for Internet Explorer. For example, at a recent US Census workshop we were told that the Census Bureau sites are not designed to be used on any other browser.

However if your machines have both browsers and a site keeps locking up in IE due to popups, you can try Mozilla. This has enabled a number of patrons to use sites which were otherwise unusable.

We don't have the money to install a commercial popup killer on almost 40 public computers. I know that Microsoft says the next release of IE will have the killer capability, but at this point Mozilla has beaten them to the punch.

There is also a stripped down (browser only, no Composer) version of Mozilla, Firebird, that still includes the popup killer feature. I haven't tried it on a work computer yet, but a friend has used it for some time at home and I recently installed it at home and have had no problems. It's quicker to load and takes less space.
