Katie,

Although we have not experienced these problems at the Algonquin Area Public Library, you might try double checking your Internet browser settings. From within Internet Explorer, click on Tools > Internet Options > Advanced. Make sure that Disable script debugging is checked (under Browsing). This should, at least, stop the annoying messages about script debugging and may allow the page to load.

Also, you'll want to delete cookies, clear the history, and delete temporary Internet Files for good measure. After you make these changes, restart the computer. (You might need to check with your IT department to make sure that any changes you make to the Browser will still be there after the computer is rebooted. Many libraries (including ours) use a program called Deep Freeze on public terminals that restores the computer's original settings after shutdown preventing any changes from becoming permanent.)

Hope this helps solve some of the problems. Good luck.

### 1918 Minnesota Alien Registration Records

The Minnesota Alien Registration of 1918 was conducted to register all foreign born persons who were living in Minnesota, but who had not yet become US citizens. The resident was required to complete a 35 question schedule and to provide much personal information, including kind and amount of property holdings. In addition to the resident's name each entry gives the county and township, village, lumber camp or city in which the form is filed.

The Iron Range Research Center holds microfilmed copies of the original 1918 Alien Registration documents for all 87 Minnesota

counties.

#### MY ANCESTORS TO BUILD EVERTON'S GENEALOGICAL HELPER MAGAZINE

We don't normally use this newsletter to sound off about business at My Ancestors, but this news is too great to keep to ourselves. If you're an old time genealogist you are most likely acquainted with the Everton company, which began in Cache Valley, Utah in 1947. If you aren't, you can still share our excitement at the opportunity of putting together a major genealogy magazine. Here's how it happened.

Holly Hansen and I met when I went to work at Everton Publishers (which had taken on the name of Family History Network). She was the editor of their magazine, formerly called The Genealogical Helper. I worked on the magazine with her and we also worked together on The Handybook for Genealogists. We both left Everton's but kept in touch and hoped we could work together again, which happily came about when we founded My



Ancestors.

Earlier this year, the holder of Everton's assets decided to donate them to the city of Logan, Utah (Cache Valley) in order to streamline his business interests. Among these assets were a library of 80,000 family history books, family newsletters, journals, maps, and a genealogical magazine. Logan City was happy to accept the donation, but wasn't in a position to manage all of the assets.

Bobbie Coray, president and CEO of the Cache Chamber of Commerce and a self-described genealogy addict, said she learned about 15 months ago that the Everton genealogical assets were in jeopardy of being liquidated. She compiled a "dream team" of family history enthusiasts who had ties to Cache Valley to put a proposal together. Bobbie contacted Holly to see if she would be willing to once again take charge of Everton's magazine and she accepted. The end result is that My Ancestors has contracted to provide all editorial content for the magazine. We'll let you know when the website for Everton's Genealogical Helper is up and running.

In addition to the magazine, plans are to have My Ancestors begin working on the next edition of The Handybook and also to offer conferences and seminars highlighting the Everton Collection. As you can imagine, we are going to be busy bees but we welcome the challenge and opportunity to provide another avenue of help for family history.

QUESTION

I would like to identify the parents of my great grandmother, Anna Leonora Loomis, who was born in 1850 in Genesee County, New York and died in 1935 in Fresno, California. I know that she joined the Episcopal Church in Arizona and worked in the Phelps Dodge Hospital in Bisbee in the 1880s. I have reason to believe that she was adopted in Batavia, New

York. The Loomis family lists no children of the appropriate age in the 1850 or 1860 censuses, but she appears with them in the 1870 in Dover, Delaware.

ANSWER from Ren? DH Bartolome

a. I would first suggest looking for a copy of Anna's death certificate from Fresno County , California in hopes that the informant knew of Anna's parent's names.

b. Next I would recommend checking Guardianship papers for Kent County, Delaware. Though Anna's birthplace is believed to be in New York , it's uncertain if she was adopted in Delaware or New York .

c. It would be helpful to analyze Episcopalian Church records of Batavia for births during the 1850 time period when Anna was born. If she was born in Batavia under a different surname, you may be able to locate her based on her date of birth and unusual middle name of Leonora.

d. I would next suggest looking in Genesee County , New York public records for the birth of Anna Leonora Loomis to her adoptive parents or other parents.

There are a few directories of genealogical societies in print let's just count em.

How many genealogists in the country, there is no way to really find an answer to this.

But in my own guesstimation for every dues paying member of a genealogical society in Colorado there are about 40 people doing genealogy who are not members.

The average that people work on their family history is about 2 and a half years. These are observations from across my reference desk.

My family has a large family reunion every year. My grandparents had 100 grandchildren. Of my cohort there are two of us actively engaged in genealogy. Of that same 100 there are three of us who collect stuff on occasion. Of the next generation down there are three who are actively engaged in genealogy.

Now, if you take it another step, of my mother's generation, among her siblings and first cousins, most of whom are now dead, of their children and generations there are including the six from my immediate family theres an additional 12 people actually doing do level of research and of those only a couple actually engaged in a detailed research project.
