Actually, the trustees of the Board for Certification voted to change the categories last fall. There are now only two categories: CG (SM) and CGL (SM).

This is the wording on their website (the SM should be in superscript):

"The Board for Certification of Genealogists(r) certifies its associates in one research category and one teaching categories that reflect the kinds of work common in the field. The category names and their related short forms (initials) are service marks owned by the Board and used by certified associates under license. The research category is:

CGSM Certified GenealogistSM

The teaching category (which requires the primary research certification) is:

CGLSM Certified Genealogical LecturerSM

Certified Genealogist associates' work extends to broadly based genealogical projects whose goal is finding the evidence, assembling the proof, and compiling a coherent historical account of the identities and

relationships of all the descendants of a particular ancestor or ancestral couple.

Certified Genealogical Lecturer associates deliver oral presentations that address genealogical subjects (sources, methods, and standards)."

Genealogists are always looking for new sources. Tracking down information about our ancestors is what we do best. Obituaries are a terrific source of information but genealogists sometimes overlook the hundreds of thousands of obituaries that are not published in newspapers.

For example the Department of the Navy annually report to the U.S. Congress includes a lengthy list of obituaries of naval personnel who passed away in the previous year. These detailed obituaries give the genealogical details of the person's birth date, birth place and death date & place as well as the details of their military career.

These reports by the Department of the Navy along with the thousands of other documents prepared for government use are consolidated in what is called the U.S. Congressional Serial Set.

I would like to add some comments to Roger?s. I fully agree with what he has written. Based on the flurry of emails in response to his, there are many others who do, too.

I, also, have voted against giving all power over the G&B to a board of fifteen and disenfranchising myself and all other members. I want what?s best for the G&B and don?t feel that the board has recommended a good way to approach the organization?s future.

I have been an active member of the NYGBS and, over the years, have served on various committees. Sadly, I have also seen the increased insularity of the board and its apparent lack of planning for the future. Its name-calling and finger-pointing are certainly not part of a proactive and wise leadership and not one I wish to entrust, blindly, with the G&B?s governance and future.

I have witnessed leadership?s intolerance with and ignoring of suggestions from members and others well qualified to advise. The board currently doesn?t include even one trustee who has a day-to-day, in-the-field working knowledge of genealogy. How can this group determine, on its own, the best way for the NYGBS to meet the future of the changing world of genealogy?

Do board members even know their own library? Certainly not all of them, based on the chairman?s incorrect statement in the last New York Researcher that, ?Most of our Library is now duplicated online and elsewhere for free.? This is patently untrue, as is well known by those familiar with the library?s collection.

What company can survive without its leadership having knowledge of its product?

I fear that the board?s attempt to eliminate members from having a say will

only lead the board into increased insularity, to the detriment of the G&B. I most sincerely hope I am wrong, but can we afford the risk of an under-informed, isolated, ?because-I-say-so? leadership?

Over the last few years, the Society?s endowment has shrunk from about \$5,000,000 to what is now probably in the low six figures. (The 2006 financials have not been posted to the website, as I gather they should have been.) Though I do not know from my own experience, I have been told that this loss was primarily due to poor investments and lack of oversight of those investments?oversight that was and is a primary fiduciary responsibility of the board.

In the chairman?s June 22, 2007, letter to the membership, he stated, in asking for members? votes in favor of disenfranchisement: ?This change is similar to the one made at the New England Historic Genealogical Society years ago, and all the members, staff, and trustees we?ve heard from have heartily recommended such governance reform to the G&B.?

Both parts of that sentence give pause. Many of us are against ?such governance reform.? This is known by the leadership.

Also, as I understand NEHGS?s governance, there is, in addition to the board, a Council of the Corporation responsible for oversight of the board. What the trustees of the G&B are proposing is to take authority away from everyone but their self-appointed group of fifteen. Where is the oversight?

If lack of oversight led us into this crisis, how can the leaders be trusted not to take the \$24,000,000 from the sale of the building and make the same mistakes again? What reasons have they given us to trust their judgment and leave them without the oversight and contributions that enfranchised members would bring? What proof have they given us over the last few years that they have any viable plans for the survival of the G&B, beyond broad, unsubstantiated statements? Why should we entrust complete control to leadership that doesn?t even know its organization?s holdings?

I, like other members, would like to see the board, as the chairman wrote, ?act nimbly and grasp its future opportunities.? I wish, with all my heart, that the G&B can get back on course and thrive. So far, I?ve seen little evidence of this board?s ability to lead. Without members? help to guide the way, I fear for the very survival of the NYG&B, its library and collection.

Please, as Roger mentioned, carefully review the proposed changes to the by-laws, before you vote, or take a look, if you have already voted without reading them. The proposed changes are available to members at http://www.newyorkfamilyhistory.org/download/pdf/bylaw_redline_707_amd_July_version.pdf

I don't know if you still want this response... Try the Allen County Public Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana. They have the 3rd largest genealogy collection in the country, they are in the state you mentioned, and they have an online catalog. The collection is strongest in materials from the mid-west. Since the Hoover family was Quaker, also try the Quaker Collection at Earlham College, Richmond, Indiana. I doubt if either of these libraries does ILL, but they may be willing to photocopy.

Note that Indiana was 50% Quaker in 1850. Also note that there are a dozen or more bulletin boards for Quaker genealogy on the net. Posting a query on some of them may help.

We've been asked by many members if it's too late to change their proxy votes to "no" or submit a proxy for the first time and have that vote counted at the G&B's special meeting this Thursday, July 19.

It's not too late, and we can help. But you need to act right away by faxing your proxy.

If:

1) You have not yet sent in your proxy vote concerning the board's proposed bylaws changes that will disenfranchise all members of the NYG&BS and absolutely and forever empower a board of 15 to unilaterally make decisions about the NYG&B's assets and future,

2) You have voted but want to change your vote and/or want to change the person to whom you give your proxy to cast your vote,

You can still do so. Here's how.

Having consulted with counsel, we have been advised that you can fax your proxies to one of us or to another member for submission at the meeting. If we're to carry your vote, we must receive your proxy by fax no later than 8:00

a.m. on Thursday, July 19, in order to take it to the G&B's special meeting held at the Society at noon that day.

6. If you voted previously and are changing your vote and/or designating one of us to submit your proxy, so indicate on your new proxy. Suggested wording: "This proxy replaces my proxy previously submitted and alters the prior vote."
7. Fax your new proxy toll-free to 1-888-667-1464. No cover sheet is needed.

If you provide an email address, we will confirm receipt of your fax.

If you want another member who is also attending the meeting to carry your proxy, then follow the same procedure and fax to that person.

Of course, in lieu of the above, you can attend the meeting and vote there.

A big thanks to all members who are concerned about the G&B's future.

After speaking with New York Genealogical & Biographical Society (NYGB) board
chairman
Waddell Stillman, I'm updating Friday's coverage of the controversial proposal to
eliminate member voting.

The proposal is a response to members' attempts to stop the sale of the society's
headquarters building (finalized in March), but Stillman says it's not retaliation.
"We're
updating our form of governance so the society isn't exposed to a repeat of the
loss of
funds. If we stood by and ignored the six-figure loss we incurred, we'd be shirking
our
duties as fiduciaries."

NYGB trustees say "a handful" of members delayed the sale, causing a loss of
investment
income based on the \$24 million sale price.

If passed, the proposal will do away with proxy voting system, which Stillman says
New
York State laws require. (The society must mail ballots to members, who can send
back
their votes, cast votes at a meeting, or designate meeting attendees to vote on
their
behalf.) The board would appoint new officers rather than hold elections.

Before issuing the proposal, NYGB's board surveyed other non-profit organizations
and
consulted with the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS), whose members
passed
a similar measure-after a similar debate-several years ago. NEHGS has an advisory
board in
addition to its board of directors.

"I WOULDN'T KNOW WHAT OUR BOARD WOULD SAY ABOUT ADOPTING THAT STRUCTURE, BECAUSE WE
DIDN'T

FULLY CONSIDER IT," says Stillman.

He says NYGB members will still have access to the group's services and online resources, though

HE DOESN'T YET KNOW WHAT THE SOCIETY WILL DO WITH ITS RESEARCH COLLECTIONS

and financial assets. (The board has two years from the building sale date to move.)

"After we take care of housekeeping matters and governance . we will face those huge questions and we'll benefit from all the debate."

That debate won't lead to reduced membership, he predicts. "I think people will act in their self-interest and then continue to enjoy the benefits of membership."

Stillman also posted to Eastman's Online Genealogy Newsletter blog-visit to read his and others' comments.

I'm looking for anyone who could possibly help a long-distance patron of ours. There seem to be two basic problems. 1) His first language is French and he lives in Quebec, 2) He doesn't seem to be an experienced genealogist.

He is doing research on people who settled in the state of Washington, specifically around Tacoma. He has emailed the librarians here at the Washington State Library probably a dozen times and the language barrier has been extreme. He has been asking for resources that we do not have, or for sources that do not have the information he wants. For example he seems to think a marriage index will tell him where a person was born and who his parents were...

Several librarians on staff here have tried to help him with his questions, but most of the time we just don't have the resources (marriage records, county level records, etc-which are located in the state archives). Or he doesn't understand the types of information that our resources will give him. We have referred him several times to the Archives, but something seems to get lost in the translation because he keeps writing back to us.

I have even tried using online translation tools-limited as those are-to respond to him in both English and French. But it doesn't seem to be working all that well. I am going to suggest that he try to find a volunteer or hire a professional researcher who speaks both English and French who can better explain what's available, where it's available, and what kind of information is available.

Does anyone on the list know of a researcher or volunteer who is fluent in both French and English, preferably with research experience in the Pacific Northwest? I tried a search on APG but have not had much luck.

Everyone,

Have any of you whose libraries use Ebsco for periodical subscriptions been notified that they will be adding a \$12.00 per subscription fee to all titles on which they do not make a profit? We were told about this a couple of months ago, and our rep talked with the regional director who insists that the fees will be applied. Naturally, we're not going to add \$5,000 to our periodicals budget and are going to have to do direct renewals with 4/5ths of our subscriptions by check and credit card.

Clearly, Ebsco doesn't want to handle these titles any longer for obvious financial reasons. If you use Ebsco and don't know about these fees because you don't deal directly with periodical renewals, you will likely take a hit on your periodicals budget if you have a substantial number of titles involved. I was very surprised to see many major historical and genealogical journals in the list of titles affected not to mention to smaller state and local newsletter, magazines, etc.

I'm looking for anyone who could possibly help a long-distance patron of ours. There seem to be two basic problems. 1) His first language is French and he lives in Quebec, 2) He doesn't seem to be an experienced genealogist.

He is doing research on people who settled in the state of Washington, specifically around Tacoma. He has emailed the librarians here at the Washington State Library probably a dozen times and the language barrier has been extreme. He has been asking for resources that we do not have, or for sources that do not have the information he wants. For example he seems to think a marriage index will tell him where a person was born and who his parents were.

Several librarians on staff here have tried to help him with his questions, but most of the time we just don't have the resources (marriage records, county level records, etc-which are located in the state archives). Or he doesn't understand the types of information that our resources will give him. We have referred him several times to the Archives, but something seems to get lost in the translation because he keeps writing back to us.

I have even tried using online translation tools-limited as those are-to respond to him in both English and French. But it doesn't seem to be working all that well. I am going to suggest that he try to find a volunteer or hire a professional researcher who speaks both English and French who can better explain what's available, where it's available, and what kind of information is available.

Does anyone on the list know of a researcher or volunteer who is fluent in both French and English, preferably with research experience in the Pacific Northwest? I tried a search on APG but have not had much luck.

"We call it a Net Charge and we have had it for several years. Publishers use to give agencies discounts on titles, but gradually they started reducing or eliminating the discounts. We were one of the last agencies to add the Net charge after this happened.

We did announce this quite widely at the time, because I remember having to explain it over and over again on the phone to customers.

Most of the popular titles that libraries order do give us discounts, so this fee is not added to those titles. You can tell which titles have the fee by seeing an "N" under the title on your Invoice and Renewal List.

Any time I am asked for a price, I tell the customer if there is a Net charge on it."

You can apparently request a NET TITLE REPORT to see what titles you are being charged this fee for.

titles on which they do not make a profit? We were told about this a couple
of months ago, and our rep talked with the regional director who insists
that the fees will be applied. Naturally, we're not going to add \$5,000 to
our periodicals budget and are going to have to do direct renewals with

4/5ths of our subscriptions by check and credit card.

Clearly, Ebsco doesn't want to handle these titles any longer for obvious financial reasons. If you use Ebsco and don't know about these fees because you don't deal directly with periodical renewals, you will likely take a hit on your periodicals budget if you have a substantial number of titles involved. I was very surprised to see many major historical and genealogical journals in the list of titles affected not to mention to smaller state and local newsletter, magazines, etc.
