This database covers over-the-ocean travel from Europe to America, with transcriptions of immigrant first-hand accounts, ship passenger lists, and other important information for thousands who emigrated during the last half of the 19th Century. New material will be added, gathered since 2000.

As a service, we have been adding completely free downloadable images of a host of 19th Century PA landowner maps and atlases to our website (<http://ancestortracks.com>). You can see the extent by going to our home page and scrolling down to the map of PA and hovering over each county. Nearly all of these maps are in the Library of Congress, and we have spent months trying to get the clearest images we can of each township of each county. So far we have posted maps covering at least 2/3 of PA counties, and we have linked to a number of other sites which have posted landowner maps and atlases. Altogether, our website includes images of cadastral maps, or links to other sites, for over ? of the land mass of PA, and our goal is to complete the state by the end of the year. Most of the images are high quality, but we will also be replacing some of the images over time with clearer versions. These maps are invaluable when used in conjunction with the 1850, 1860, 1870 and 1880 census records, as well as the many county histories that were written around the time these maps were drafted. Our website is the most comprehensive one-stop site for free PA landowner maps and atlases. Some of you may be interested in a new DVD we have produced. It is essentially meant for individual researchers--we all know this is not the format of choice for libraries--but it does have some very good resources on it for persons doing Oklahoma research in the 1889-1890 time period.

The 1890 census for Oklahoma Territory was not sent to Washington and so survived the destruction that was the fate of that decade's census. These images are available online at Ancestry, but we re-scanned the originals and re-indexed (+50,000 names) them. They are much better both to view and to read the index.

Also included is the first directory for Oklahoma Territory. It was published in Guthrie, OT, which was the original capital city of the area. This directory

provides the legal descriptions for homesteads in addition to the listings of the persons living in towns.

Finally, The First Eight Months of Oklahoma City by Bunky is a colorful account of a colorful place that sprang up overnight with the 1889 land run--Oklahoma City.

Hi, all--

My experience as a genealogy librarian for 5 years and a genealogist for decades is that it occurs to very few people that THEIR family has skeletons in it. Of course, given the wide range of what used to be considered a skeleton in the past (poverty, mental illness, physical disabilities, out-of-wedlock children, hastily

arranged last-minute weddings, affairs, remarriage without benefit of divorce or death, time spent in institutions of any kind, adoption, and more) EVERY family turns out to have them.

Many people find these skeletons funny or interesting, fortunately. A patron I helped today had never been able to find any records of a particular ancestor's death; he just disappeared between 1855 (selling land) and 1862 (wife's remarriage). As a last resort, we looked at an index my library has to insanity cases -- and there he was, committed in 1857. (Now the question is, did he die or get divorced before his wife remarried? There's no evidence of either...) The patron, far from being shocked, burst out into laughter. "I always told my mom that her family was crazy," she said.

What I usually try to do, when helping a patron who has found one of these fascinating events in their family tree, is explain that these unusual twists in family trees were (and are) extremely common. I then give some fairly innocuous reasons why they might have happened, so that the patron does not think that their ancestors were necessarily "bad" people. So I talk about the scarcity of preachers in very remote areas when people find ancestors who didn't seem to get married before their children were born. Or about how it was much easier to commit someone to a mental institution in the past, even for reasons that don't have anything to do with insanity as we would define it today -- disturbing behavior related to Alzheimer's or other diseases of aging, for instance. Or about how a relative who ended up in jail in 1936 might have stolen food or engaged in illegal work to keep his family fed in the middle of the Great Depression.

My own family research has turned up a grandmother's never-revealed first marriage and divorce, an ancestor who died in a mental institution of advanced syphilis, weddings that just barely predated births, and an ancestor who had to flee to avoid being jailed or lynched for fraud, among many other varied and interesting stories. Of course, I've also found dedicated religious leaders, ancestors who adopted children orphaned by untimely deaths, a policeman great-grandfather who was shot in the line of duty, and other interesting and slightly more positive events. Every family has both!

Interesting line of discussion -- thanks to Liliana for the Telegraph article.

Every now and then ALA/RUSA also offers an online genealogy course. I think Jack Simpson might still teach it. BTW. Jack used to work at the Newberry in Chicago - one of the areas premier genealogy collection. He's a very good speaker.

Dave Dowell commented on Lynn's remark about switching trains of thought. Here is my viewpoint.

The reference interview needs to change from a "what are you looking for" type to ask the following questions:

What is the goal of your research today/ what question are you trying to answer? (Try to get them to be specific here, the more focused they are, the better you can help - "I want to find my ancestors" is NOT a good goal.)

When (in time) and where (location) are you looking to try to answer your question?

After you know these answers, you can try and evaluate what resources are available to meet their needs, where those resources exist (online, print, another library/repository), and how that resource should be searched.

Only then, do you get to the "who" they are looking for.

Several years ago, upon my request, a lawyer relative filed an FOIA request with the FBI to get info on a relative who had been a Yippie. The initial request was rejected but an appeal produced 11 pages, several of them largely blacked out. The appeal indicated that there were 4 more pages available but they would not be provided unless I could provide some additional info. I could not do this so did not further pursue the matter. I believe, however, that knowing the rarity of my name, (and being the FBI!) they could be sure it was the same person and provided those pages. They also indicated pursuant to 5 U. S. C. section 552 (b) (6) that they would not release other pages.

I have provided FOIA info to several patrons over the years, but do not know the outcomes.

I hope this helps.
