Folks, I was directed to this list, so I apologize for posting just a minute or two after I subscribed, but I really need some information:

We have been given a scrapbook.

The covers are padded vinyl and are 10 1/2" wide and 13 1/8" high. The pages are 10 3/8 - 1/4" wide. The scrapbook was made in Japan. It is spiral wire bound, with *big wire.*

The earliest entry is 1967, and most of the items are newspaper articles *glued* to the page.

There are two pieces of paper that are not newspaper articles that are also glued to the page (or were).

The cover had been wet and smelled to high heaven when it was given to us. But, since it's the history of the library, we had to do something about it. I put it in a trashcan with cat litter and it's been there for months. We just took it out. The smell is gone.

Now, how do I go about preserving this? I have Bookkeeper Deacidification Spray.

Should I cut each article out, complete with its backing and put into a new scrapbook? The woman who made the scrapbook has handwritten material written right on the pages, but very little - just her name, etc.

(The staff tell me that scrapbooks aren't made in this size any more.)

Thanks for any advice. We do have this newspaper on microfilm and I can put together something with that, but it would be nice to keep this "hard copy," too.

We have microfilmed the most heavily used Polk and other directories for Charleston only, as well as our West Virginia gazetteers (1880-1920's). I had to push for it to be done since the emphasis at the time was catching up with a backlog of newspapers to be microfilmed (small town papers not being filmed by the commercial companies). They were literally crumbling. We hope to microfilm more, but newspapers and state documents take precedence. We have not digitized because up til now we did not have the capability. We have the equipment now, but again, directories will not be at the top of the priority list.

They are a valuable resource and I applaud those who collect them and preserve them.

Hi Eric,

I've taught a Genealogy Information Services continuing education course online for both the Univ. of Wisconsin and Simmons College library schools. Although aimed at librarians and archivists, the first section of the course does cover genealogy research.

The students work on the course at their own pace in one week intervals, including readings and participating in online discussions. To make myself available to answer their questions, etc., I set aside an hour or two each day (usually at night) during the class. It tends to be a 7 day a week endeavor, but it is extremely rewarding. The bulk of the work on the instructor's part takes place in planning and preparing the course. I've used Desire2Learn and Moodle course management software, and prefer Desire2Learn as being more flexible. I upload Word or PDF files of lecture notes, notes from a guest "speaker" plus PDF's of any articles, or chapters of books for the weekly readings. I'm going to try to experiment with video (or at least audio) lectures next time, if I can get my hands on the appropriate equipment/software.

I'm revising the syllabus this spring, adding some new topics and changing the required readings and discussion questions, but I can send you a copy of the last syllabus and some assessment criteria and learning objectives I've been working on lately.

Old Cherokee Families reportedly had an interesting birth. The manuscript was mailed to the publisher with the expectation of a typeset draft being returned to the author for error corrections and updating. The publisher decided to go directly to publication before a pending union strike occurred.

Because Starr used oral traditions for the most part, his work often contains relationships not recorded elsewhere. Those same traditions, however, also suffers from the weakened memories of some of his informants.

Scholars, such as David Keith Hampton and others, use Starr's publication as only one of many sources when researching Cherokee genealogy.

The "Ask Granny" Program for Genealogical Librarians

"Ask Granny" is a set of program materials sent for free by email for use in helping Senior Citizens capture on paper their irreplaceable memories of family names, dates, and places. The program requires only the printout of the materials and a pencil...no computers involved. The goal is that, with the use of the materials, no family member should ever say "Why didn't we ask Granny about that?"

The complete set of 25 files was developed for Genealogical Societies that want to create an "Ask Granny" program in their areas. Societies and Family Reunion groups in over 30 states, in Australia, Canada, and the UK have requested and received the files. The only stipulation is that no group ever charges for program attendance. Now, from the complete Granny set, 12 files have been selected for the use of Genealogical Librarians in the library or in outreach programs. The Librarian's set includes:

The "Ask Granny" Ancestral chart, entitled "A Genealogical Gift to my Family," an "Ask Granny" Family Group Record, and a form for recording "My Grandchildren,"

** student notes,

** instructor's notes,

** sign-up sheets for 12 or 20 students and class day sign-in sheet,

** newsletter announcement text, and

** examples of good genealogical form for names, dates, and places.

All of the files can be printed, used as slides, or enlarged for posters.

Authors Judy Russell and Greg Crane want to make it as easy as possible for librarians to set up their own "Ask Granny" programs. Russell and Crane developed and refined the materials as they presented the program locally to over 400 "Grannies and Grandpas," ranging in age up to 100 years. The files they've selected for Librarians include everything

needed to set up a program, only eliminating some administrative items, such as name badges and brochures, which Genealogical Societies might use. Although this is not a set of beginning genealogy materials, many students have become interested in looking further into their family trees after working on their Ancestral Charts and talking to family members about details.
