We have a not-for-profit here which exists as a clearing house to collect donations of office furniture and equipment, computers and office electronics (phone systems, copies, fax machines, etc.), and office supplies. Most of it used, but sometimes they receive items which were purchased and then never put into use.

All of this is offered for sale to both the public and not-for-profits, with the latter receiving a generous discount off the already low prices. I guess you could call it a specialized thrift store.

Ours has a large warehouse with a wide selection. They will put special wants on a list and call you when something comes in, but I have seldom had much success with that. The best way is just to go in and check to see what is available when you need something. You do get significant savings, but have to invest some time. I was able to furnish a suite of offices for a local society almost entirely with finds from there, over a period of several months. The finished result cost a fraction of what it would have otherwise.

One of the managers once told me that they have some counterparts in some other cities. You might check in your yellow pages under some appropriate categories, or perhaps call some not-for-profits in the area to see if they are aware of one in your area.

I agree with Cindy, that vendors who do not cater to libraries specifically may be less expensive. I have also had good success searching out specific items online, and finding them at significant savings, even after paying shipping.

Building a good rapport with them can get you a lot of useful items that would otherwise end up in the landfill.

Hi Charlotte,

I was checking Seymour on the web and see that it is just a bit smaller than my town of Troy, Ohio. Your library also looks very similar.

Right now the our Main Library still purchases a city directory every year because it is used quite often by individuals. When a new directory is received the "old one" is transferred to the Local History Branch. We have a fairly nice collection of city directories and they are used in a variety of ways, including families looking for relatives, finding out where "Grandma Jones" lived, environmental surveys of properties, business research, etc. I have personally used them here as well in other cities and have found them easy to access and quite valuable in what they can tell me.

The directories offer a "view" of the community in a way nothing else does, especially between census years. In theory, they list everyone whether they have a landline (phone) or not . . . something the phone books do not do. So, we do consider them quite valuable and useful in the present and for a future research.

You might check on a few things. Does the company (Polk City Directories or who ever) keep a copy for their archives or deposit a copy in another archive anywhere, or is that volume gone when they are out of them? Do they offer a microfilm or digital version at a lower cost? These are some of the issues I would look into. If it is "no" to all of these questions, then I would think very hard before I would agree with not purchasing one, but that is just me. I think they are very useful, but if your budget is really suffering, then decisions need to be made. Personally, I would rather do without some new "genealogical" purchases every year rather than stop receiving the directory.

Is there anyone else in Seymour purchasing these directories, like attorneys, businesses, etc.? Sometimes a deal can be worked out where they would transfer them to the History Collection of your library after 3-5 years beyond the date of use.

A few thoughts.

As usual, there were several thoughtful responses to this question before I weighed in, but..

Several years ago my library stopped buying the Polk directories. One of the staff went through the last 15 years for the street she lives on, and it was only in 4 of the 15 years. The street that the library is located on (South Avenue, a main thoroughfare in Rochester), is numbered in the city up to almost 2500 before it is renamed in a suburban town. The directories have it stopping at less than 400, within sight of the library. Almost half of the city streets are missing. Very many people decided not to send back information (although a phone call to the compilers elicited the fact that the company uses college students to make phone calls to verify information.) And cell numbers are not in the city directories at all.

So, since there is an east and west edition of the city and 3 more editions for the suburbs (and all the suburbs are not included!), we decided to forego the 500 dollar per volume cost. 2500 dollars is a HUGE portion of our book budget, and when you read to a caller, that it isn't listed, or some sort of fact like that, you get the response, then why did you buy that? And we could not justify the cost for an inferior product.

They were OK down to the mid 90s, but have gone so far downhill that they are not worth the purchase. A hard decision but a necessary one.

Larry,

I agree with you for the most part. Most of us have been in this research "business" for some time, whether as a professional or as a researcher, and we would acknowledge that there are definitely errors and omissions in resources. Publishers, like directory companies, can only work with what they are "given" or the data they gather.

As politely as I can say it, I would still hold to my statement that directories are a very useful tool for several reasons. I am not trying to be negative Larry, but Rochester is a city of over 1 million . . . Troy (my town) is 22,000 and Seymour, Indiana is slightly smaller than that. The errors in a publication are definitely going to rise with the population just because of the immense amount of data which needs to be gathered and retained. I am not saying our directories are without error, just fewer from my experience.

In addition, I do not know if publications for cities like Rochester do the same, but everyone (again, in theory) is listed in our directories even if they are not in the phone book (b/c of cells or unlisted numbers) - they are listed at their address with no phone contact info.

Finally, we have no other resource which can/will replace our directories with such as "complete" survey of the city, especially one that will be here in 20,30, or 50 years.

I can definitely see the problem if \$2500 per year is expended on these volumes . . . that's huge! Right now, \$300-\$400 is expensive, but a good investment for the use they receive, as far as our thinking.

Also, it might be a good idea for you to talk a little about what library has the newspaper microfilm in your state and what their policies are. In Indiana, the Indiana State Library has the largest single collection of Indiana newspaper microfilm that exists and they will loan it out at a ridiculously low price. (We get it free, but I'm not sure what they do for out-of-state people.)

Most of the points I was going to add have been touched on, but the points I would reiterate are

- * Some libraries have duplicates of their local history and/or genealogy titles that WILL lend, so it's always worth trying
- * I agree that sometimes academic libraries will lend while public libraries will not; technical colleges and community colleges seem to lend even more (although it's hit and miss what they have)
- * In addition to the online full-text sources that have already been mentioned, HathiTrust Digital Library (www.hathitrust.org/) has a lot of free full-text applicable titles. If a patron asks for an ILL for something we discover is available online, we add a cataloging record to our online catalog for that title (with a live link). This is based on the theory that others in our area might also be interested in the same topic and/or family. So patrons should make sure to check their local catalog(s) too.
- * Many libraries now have been designated at FamilySearch Centers by the LDS. We can borrow in the LDS microfilms (for a cost) when there are no other ILL copies available.

In completing that project, I first OCRd and electronically indexed documents, then "tweaked" those results manually, cross referencing when indicated.

This reminds me of an issue that came up at a University Archives that I worked in. They were digitizing and making their annuals available online and had several requests that certain pages not be included. In particular, an alumnus didn't want pages posted that showed him participating in a war protest on campus. The University Archivist's take on it was that it would be unethical to delete certain pages just as it would be unethical to remove the pages out of the actual yearbook or to remove them if they were in a processed collection. Of course, the other side of the debate is that putting them online is making them much more accessible than they would have been physically in the archives.

I think whatever the library/archives decides-they should develop policy for it. If you omit things for one patron, then you have to consistently omit for other patrons. Or you would also have the policy to fall back on for not removing things as well.

Without fanfare the Family Search Beta site has released a set of records entitled Virginia, Freedmen's Bureau Letters, 1865 - 1872. Attempting to respond to a query by someone on Afrigeneas.com, I tried to locate the document she had posted, which she had said was part of the Freedmen's Bureau Letters 1865-1872. I googled that term and it took me to the Family Search Beta site. Although I found the record she cited with the person she mentioned, I was not sure where I was in the Bureau records, by last night I had figured it out. what Family Search had released was Record Group 105 of the Records of the Field Offices for the State of Virginia, Bureau of Refugees, Freedmen and Abandoned Lands, 1865-1872??? Indexed by Name and digital images, over 800, 000 images on 203 reels of microfilm. A Gold Mine for African American Researchers (and not just Virginia Researchers).

It is incorrect to say that those who were enslaved are not in the records prior April 1865 and the end of the Civil War and the general emancipation, look at any county court record where ?property? is listed wills, deeds, we are there?but those enslaved individuals do not speak for themselves?.in these FB Records many of the people we seek ?Speak for Themselves?... give their names, their children's names, wives, go to court, make labor contracts, complain about their treatment as Free Men and Women, ask for transport back to their homes after they had run to Union

held territory in VA to contraband camps, marry, take a census?too many other things for me to mention.

In 1993 James Walker ([\[http://www.aagsnc.org/articles/walker.htm\]](http://www.aagsnc.org/articles/walker.htm)
<http://www.aagsnc.org/articles/walker.htm>), co-founder of AAHGS and Archivist at the National Archives had spoken to our AAHGS Chapter about the historical value and the immense wealth of information of these records and implored us to go and see them. A couple of months later I did have an opportunity to see some of them. They were not microfilmed and in their original state, I was overwhelmed. In the early 2000?s these records were microfilmed. Thank You Pearl Alice & Reginald Washington([\[http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~gaaahgs/id107.htm\]](http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~gaaahgs/id107.htm)

The Freedmen Records and African American Family History? . Dr. Walden had spoken to other AAHGS Chapters and other groups about an Extraction and Indexing Project of the names that appear in all of the 203 reels of VA records. Many of us were inspired to work on that effort. It was finally complete in 2008. It has taken awhile but it is finally On-Line. I know you all want to know how to get to the records but I did think that it is important that those people and there are many others, who understood the immense value of these records for family researchers, historians, be remembered and given credit. These documents not only tell the story of OUR participation in Virginia?s and the Nation?s history at a most crucial time period, but others as well, Freedmen Bureau officials, White Virginians and ALL who had contact with the Bureau, for whatever reason.

I can?t promise you that everyone will find what they are looking, nor will it be easy to maneuver thru this site (I have been working on it all day) but it is an incredible resource. I strongly suggest that you look at the Descriptive Pamphlet which describes what is in this Record set and gives a general description of what is on each reel?this is a link to the Pamphlet at NARA:

Put in a name, it will take you to each image where that name appears, (hopefully no one is looking for John Smith). You then click on the image. Yes, you have to read it?and the handwriting is not always good, and some images are faint?and maybe the names are not always spelled they way you think it should be spelled (like the census Spelling don?t count), or maybe we didn?t transcribe it the way you think we should have?but you are at home on your computer. So don?t complain.

When you find someone, remember you are looking at an image without a context, you need to understand the context in which this record was generated, which is why I suggest you Read the descriptive pamphlet (those folks in my group..we passed out these pamphlets a couple of years ago..go find it)

If you have the descriptive pamphlet?Read what is on the reel, that might be of interest. This is the link to the page with each reel . The numbers there DO NOT match the Reel Numbers, but there are 203 individual numbers there that reflect the 203 Reels.

Example the last number is #4152459 which is Reel 203

It helps that I used to volunteer at a regular Family History Center, but it has been a couple of years, and there we were able to use the inventory database that regular FHCs use, which made checking on the status of orders, printing out lists of current inventory, and calculating due dates a snap. Since we don't have that software (I think it is only given to LDS-run Family History Centers?) we will have to figure out our own (paper-based) methods of doing these things. I am particularly interested in how other libraries handle keeping track of the films and allowing patrons to see what is currently in the library.

Finally, there seems to be some confusion about whether we should be paying/charging tax; since we are a tax-exempt institution I would assume not, but I haven't gotten much definite info from SLC, despite several phone calls (always very courteously received, but the tax question seemed to be very difficult for them to answer). Does anyone have any experience with this?
