PRINCE WILLIAM DIGITAL LIBRARY

Early Prince William and Stafford County tax lists, as transcribed by RELIC volunteer Greg Mason from microfilm images, are now a part of our Digital Library at <http://eservice.pwcgov.org/library/digitalLibrary/index.htm> <<http://eservice.pwcgov.org/library/digitalLibrary/index.htm>> . We thank the Huntington Library, San Marino, California, for allowing us to post the lists that are part of their Brock Collection. We also thank the Library of Virginia for assistance with materials in their collection. Those posted now include (under Historic Records, 1700-1800):

? Stafford County: 1723 rent roll, 1724 tobacco tenders. Most of Prince William was carved out of Stafford in 1731.

? Prince William County: 1738/39 (Hamilton Parish), 1746, 1751/52, 1754, 1758, 1761/62, 1762, 1765, 1767, 1773.

These lists are essential for tracing persons living in Prince William County during the 18th century. The lists for 1724 and 1765 include the names of slaves and white males who did not own land. Each list is keyword searchable, and they are also indexed in Mr. Mason's Prince William County People, 1701-1800, likewise online.

We have also added to our Newspaper Archive, on the same page. It now includes all extant issues of local newspapers before 1923. Newest additions:

? The Manassas Democrat, 1909-1921

? The Manassas Journal, 1895-1922.

? The Prince William News, 1921-1923. (Successor to The Manassas Democrat)

Some of the images are OCR keyword searchable. Other images, because of poor image quality or scanning problems are not. You can tell if an issue is searchable by opening it and pressing CTRL+A: Text areas will be highlighted in blue, indicating it has been processed by Optical Character Recognition software. Use CTRL+F to get the search box. Enter any word or phrase. The software will highlight in blue each place in the text where the word or words appear.

We will be adding more newspapers and hope to upgrade our search capabilities as time goes by. We would welcome your comments and suggestions about these efforts to make our historic newspapers accessible. Funding for this project has been supported by the Prince William County Historical Commission.

Library visitors simply sit down and use them- no library card needed, no login, nothing. We have 3 that people can check out to use in the library for 4 hours-nothing leaves the building. The advantage to these is that a person can use one anywhere in the building.

The 'walk up' ipads are quite popular.

A couple of years back I decided to convert all our slides to some semblance of order. We have 6 children and I wanted each of them to have the family photos. I put the slides in chronological order (about 30 years worth); one set for Our Family; one set for Family Gatherings. I had 1,000 for Our Family after deleting the sunset or mountain scenes, and 500 for Family Gatherings.

I used a place called DigMyPics in Mesa, AZ. They not only airbrushed the dust off the slides but actually enhanced some that needed help. I was surprised at how nicely they did this. I had a master copy and then duplicate copies made for family and relatives.

You can order a booklet that shows small thumbnail pix so you can readily reference a photo you need. I ordered a DVD of each set and a CD from which individual photos can be printed.

They are online and certainly nice people to work with. By the time I bought a scanner and did all the work, I felt I saved myself many hours of frustration by putting it in their hands.

All the info is online and they have people who will answer questions for you and guide you. They have instructions as well that helped me immensely. It was not cheap but I figured it was equal to what I would have spent on Christmas gifts for all concerned.

I am afraid you will find many collections such as ours that do not participate in ILL. Even if we did, the majority of our genealogy collection in particular would not be eligible for ILL because many are one of kind family histories donated as manuscripts that we have had bound in library bindings. Even some of our record transcription books were compiled by local societies or individuals, consisting of computer print-outs or photocopies stapled together with paper covers, and never widely distributed. Unless we happened to have two or more copies, ILL would not be feasible.

It's not so much a matter of whether to be helpful or not helpful to patrons, but of priorities. For those of us who have archival collections, special collections, etc., if we only have one copy of a title, we need to have it available to the patron who drove across the state or across the country and is only here for one day to use it. If a library does not have a separate circulating collection, loaning books that are stored intermingled with non-circulating books, many of them comparatively rare and for all practical purposes irreplaceable, is not a wise practice.

Copyright also comes into play when photocopying pages of a single work to send out. We follow a fair use policy of 20% of the total pages. If we have contact information for the compiler or publisher of the book, we will provide it.

We'll do everything we can to help a patron find the information they need, but we draw the line at sending the entire book.

Lots of good suggestions already made-I would just add that it's always worth checking the OCLC policy directory to see what exactly a library will lend and under what conditions. For example, at Omaha Public Library we do not lend most of our genealogy room books, but we do lend family genealogies for in-library use only, unless they are very fragile. Some libraries don't lend through OCLC, but will lend in response to an email or telephone call. Also, some universities will maintain in their circulating collection a book that a public or genealogy library would probably catalog as reference. I've found I should never assume a genealogy ILL request is impossible.... J

A very helpful online tool for finding digitized county histories is Debbie Duay's site at <http://www.learnwebskills.com/patriot/countyhistories1.htm> There you can simply search by state and county, and find what's available whether it's at GoogleBooks, Archive.org, or whatever.

Another last resort-the Family History Library has microfilmed a great many books; a growing number are available digitally, but those that aren't can still be ordered to a local FamilySearch Center. Our library is a FamilySearch Library Affiliate, which is convenient for patrons, but if your library is in a town of any size there is probably a FamilySearch Center not too far away where the patron could view the film.

As the Genealogy Reference Librarian at the State Library of North Carolina in Raleigh, NC. I wanted to give some input on the practices of our library. None of our genealogy books circulate and most of our genealogy collection, which include books, maps, family charts, vertical files, and microform, are not available for ILL. We do have exceptions with microfilm. Our microfilm duplicates many of the films created by and held at the State Archives of North Carolina. Part of the

reason we have these films is for patrons to use when the Archives are closed to the public. In the past year or so, our library changed hours for Genealogical Services and our hours now coincide with the Archives. Now, with the exception of when the Archives are closed for inventory, the only use the microfilm gets is through ILL. Some of our microfilm includes revolutionary war records for NC, county records for NC, Native American census rolls, and other NC specific records. These films are only available to NC residents through ILL because the same films are also at the library for the LDS church library in Salt Lake City. Non-NC residents can visit a local Family History Center and request those films locally. We also have newspapers on microfilm and those can be sent to anywhere in the U.S. using ILL.

I have been asked from patrons if we can scan pages from genealogy books and send them via email, but we do not do that for genealogy books, we do however do something similar to that for the regular collections.

Click on the publication title. That will take you to a new screen. Click on "View Important Publication Details" on the far right side - this will give you the descriptive pamphlet and allow you to (1) open & print or (2) download (then you can print) (or, depending on your computer - it may just download automatically).

Not all descriptive pamphlets are online. Sometimes, it's just the roll list.

Mary,

Our Society has been doing successful cemetery walks for over ten years. We typically have 6-8 characters per cemetery (we use three cemeteries). We only change the characters every few years, but still get around 75-100 attendees per session. Characters are usually portrayed by a local theater group called the Heritage Players (they do an historically themed program each year for local societies) or Board or Society members. They try to dress, speak, and act in character. The characters consist of local residents buried in the cemetery that have historical significance - Curly Lambeau (a founder and first coach of the Green Bay Packers), or Austin Straubel (local WWII hero for which our airport is named after). Each character usually gives a short biography of the person and describes any significant events from their life - they last from 5-20 minutes depending on the number of characters and amount of biographical material available. I portrayed

Austin Straubel for a few summers and have attached my "script." Mine was shorter than most, but you can probably get the idea. I think our director is creating a file of characters (with bibliographies) for future reference. I guess the biggest problems are finding volunteers and the weather. I understand your situation, and I sympathize, but we receive a pitiful amount of state funds on which to run the entire Archives, not just the library portion. We have never had adequate funds, and the current economic climate just makes things worse. We spend almost all of our acquisition funds on subscriptions to West Virginia newspapers, on subscriptions to the microfilmed versions available, and on microfilming ourselves the majority of our state's papers that are not commercially microfilmed. We depend on our friends group to purchase most of our books, and their funds are limited as well. We recommend books to them for donation, and they purchase others on their own and donate them. We receive the vast majority of our book acquisitions by donation.

The situation is just as frustrating for us as for the authors. We want to build and develop a strong, comprehensive collection for our area. The only thing I can say to authors is that some of our patrons will purchase a book they have found useful in our library.
