I don't know about costs, but there is no single newspaper subscription service that will cover the United States. And, as each service covers different papers for different time periods, your best choice will be

different than other libraries.

My recommendation:

1. find out what service best covers the area(s) your patrons research

2.

include links to Chronicling America and links to your state's major online Digital Newspaper repository(s) on your website. Each state has/had a digitizing program. Some put their scans up on Chronicling America while others either developed their own page or put the images up on an existing project, frequently run by either the State Library or a major university.

3. Add a link to Elphind.com (a newspaper search engine). Google News (news.google.com) also searches some accessible newspapers (not all free), but you need to learn how to persuade it you are looking for old newspapers, not current - via advanced search.

4.

This answer refers to Ancestry.com, not Ancestry Library Edition. There are several options on the Advanced Search that you can set which are "sticky," meaning that they will stay from search to search and won't change until you reset them. The first is "Match all terms exactly" at the top of the Advanced Search. (Personally, I don't use that, as you can end up excluding a record that is "close," but not "exact.") The second set of options that will greatly control your results are down at the bottom of the search in the "Collection Priority" section. There you can limit your results to only collections from a particular country and/or specific collections types, such as historical records. Be sure to check the box "Show only records from these collections." (If you don't check that box, other countries or record types will appear in results, but will be lower on the list.)

Two things I finally figured out (I also prefer the old search) in addition to using "Match All Terms Exactly".

1) Change "Use Default Settings" to "Restrict to Exact" to avoid getting thousands of records that have nothing to do with what you asked for. Obviously my definition of "Default" is not the same as theirs. Under the "Restrict to Exact" you can choose Soundex to broaden the search. And you can always use the wild cards.

2) When the results are displayed, chose the tab "Categories" on the upper right corner instead of "Records". It organized the results like the old search instead of giving you what seems to be a random list of items.

by 1929 Scandinavians owned more reservation acreage than their Dakota neighbors.

the Indians."

With this largely unknown story at its center, Encounter on the Great Plains brings
together two dominant processes in American history: the unceasing migration of

Essential Duties Include:

- * Oversees the staffing, function, and schedules of the reference/information desks and the Seimes Technology Center, as well as supervising and managing the Search Services activities and staff.

- * Experience developing programs, community outreach opportunities and other activities that help promote and showcase the library's collection.
- * Experience working with visitors or patrons providing information, resources, or services, preferably serving on a reference desk.

- * Excellent management and supervisory capabilities; specifically the ability to lead a team and inspire excellence.
- * Outstanding written, verbal and listening communication skills and ability to interact effectively with broad range of people, including a diverse staff, executive committee, a large membership and the public. Strong organizational and interpersonal skills are essential.
- * Applies knowledge of professional library principles, best practices and procedures and maintains a current awareness of trends and developments in the fields of American genealogical research and state and local history.
- * Demonstrated success in prioritizing among multiple competing assignments, projects or programs.
